- Be an Elk County, PA resident
- Must meet PHEAA financial eligibility requirement
- Be currently enrolled at least half-time (six credits) in a PHEAA-approved higher education institution in a program of study at least two years in length; High School Seniors are eligible as long as they will meet this requirement for the upcoming Fall 2016 Semester
