Allegheny County municipalities must have an established tree ordinance and shade tree committee/ commission in order to apply to TreeVitalize Pittsburgh for trees.

Any municipality above median income level in Allegheny County is required to match TreeVitalize technical support with project funding.

Priority will be given to municipalities with low tree canopy cover.

Applications must be completed in full before submitting, including all supporting documents, maps, and municipal support letter.

Completed applications and supporting documentation should be submitted via email to trees@paconserve.org. Applications received after **4 pm on Friday, March 18th 2016** will not be eligible for the fall 2016 planting season. Please answer every question thoroughly. If a question does not apply to your project, please write N/A on the application.
