Educational Benefits

Colfax's outdoor classroom provides students with the opportunity to learn in a beautiful, openair setting. Comprised of natural stone benches encircled by 'Winter Gem' boxwood shrubs, the space is ideal for teachers to hold self-directed reading time or outdoor science labs, or to teach lessons of any kind.

Next to the 'classroom' lies a raised-bed food garden, created through Grow Pittsburgh's Edible Schoolyard initiative. The garden is an excellent educational tool, useful for teaching students about their food's source and for instilling healthy eating habits.





Beautification

A variety of flowering and evergreen shrubs adorn the front of Colfax. Arborvitae and viburnum shrubs add a deep green contrast to the school's red brick wall. In the spring and summer, the 'Glowing Ember' hydrangea boast bold crimson flowers while the mountain laurel produce soft white and pinkish-white blossoms.
