The London planetrees planted at Sterrett add color and interest along the school's parking lot. London plane trees are known for their silvery 'spotted' bark that flakes off, revealing lighter cream and grey-colored layers. The blue spruce trees planted along the school's metal fence remain colorful through winter and their bluish-green foliage can be enjoyed year round.

Environmental Benefits

The 10 trees planted at Sterrett are currently 2" in diameter. If they are well cared for and grow to 8", they have the potential (per year) to:

Absorb 7,285 gallons of storm water runoff

Conserve 365 kilowatt hours of electricity by cooling the building

Reduce atmospheric carbon by 1,525 pounds
