Applications must be completed in full before submitting, including all supporting documents, maps, tree request forms, etc.

Completed applications and supporting documentation should be submitted via email to trees@paconserve.org. Applications received after **4 p.m. on Friday, March 15th, 2019**, will not be eligible for the fall 2019 planting season. Please answer every question thoroughly. If a question does not apply to your project, please write N/A on the application.
